Quick Facts: Feline Allergic Dermatitis

THE SIGNS

Itchiness, Scratching, Licking, Foul odor,
Red bumps / Scaly areas, Head shaking,
Hair thinning or loss, Darkened skin

Areas most affected:

- Ears
- Groin
- Wrists
- Around the eyes
- Ankles
- Between the toes
- Underarms

DID YOU KNOW?

Allergic dermatitis is a chronic skin condition, mostly caused by harmless substances.

With time, symptoms will worsen. They can also correlate to certain seasons.



THE CULPRITS

- Animal danders
- Flea or food allergy
- House dust mites
- Airborne antigens (mold spores, grasses & weeds pollen, etc.)



Cats can be more sensitive, genetically.

THE SOLUTIONS

Appropriate treatments will be determined by your veterinarian, but may include:

- Medications and sprays
- Allergen injections



Ask your veterinarian about enrolling your cat in a clinical study for a potentially new treatment for allergic dermatitis.
